EWG-ORD has been organising yearly workshops to promote the importance of operational research in improving the lives of people in developing and developed countries.

The development concept has been evolving over time. The Millennium Development Goals established in 2000 by the United Nations have been replaced in 2016 by the wider and much more ambitious Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), consisting of 17 goals to end poverty, protect the planet and ensure prosperity for all, affecting all sectors in developing and developed countries. Among other things, the OR discipline can enable incorporation of consistent objectives and establishment of optimum policies and procedures.
